##### Kicking the Alert and Oriented X 3 Habit: Rationale, Examination and Interventions for Patients with Cognitive Dysfunction

Attention and cognition are important contributors to motor control and motor learning. For many years, physical therapists have assessed attention and cognition using the 'alert and orient times three' paradigm. Unfortunately, level of alertness and degree of orientation provide only a superficial and incomplete picture of an individual's cognitive status. Attention is the ability to focus one's consciousness on specific information in order to form memories and learn, and is impacted by consciousness, arousal, awareness, and motivation. Cognition incorporates awareness, reasoning, judgment, intuition, and memory; whereas executive functions are the cognitive skills that involve planning, manipulating information, recognizing errors, problems solving, and abstract thinking. This session will provide a sound rationale for testing attention and cognition using valid and reliable measures; to demonstrate tests that can be used in clinical practice; and to discuss how to interpret results and apply findings to the physical therapy plan of care.
